In recent years, District Attorney General Mike Dunavant and Tennessee's district attorneys have implemented the efforts below to raise awareness of some of the most serious issues facing our state.



Tennessee has long had one of the worst meth problems of any state in the U.S. *Meth Destroys* used a video, website, youth and adult brochures, posters, and other materials to tell Tennesseans how *Meth Destroys* lives, families and communities.



District attorneys saw there was a need for teenage parents to be informed of the legal ramifications of teen pregnancy. *What's the Rush?* used a video, Facebook page, brochure and posters to educate students and parents on the legal responsibilities and repercussions of becoming a parent.



Deceptive Danger provided Tennessee-specific information on prescription medication abuse and synthetic drug abuse. A video, two posters and a brochure were created for the campaign and focused on dispelling the myth that synthetic drugs and prescription medications are any less dangerous than other illegal drugs.
